While these individuals may seldom afford gifts, ROTOM stands as a beacon of hope-recognizing that even those in the twilight of their years, living in poverty, deserve the warmth of a thoughtful Christmas gift.

Jajja Florence M. joined the ROTOM family in 2011. Initially, she was a village volunteer; extending her helping hand to frail seniors in fellowships and also ensuring they kept up with their medication. Witnessing her fellow grannies receiving Christmas gifts, Florence held onto a belief that someday, the benevolence of others would also touch her life.

This Christmas marks more than a decade of joy for the 73-year-old Jajja Florence. Over the years, she has unwrapped blessings that have illuminated her life—a new solar lamp, a thermos flask, Gomesis, green stoves, water tanks, a radio and shoes. Among these, she speaks with particular fondness about the radio and a pair of shoes.

Being an active volunteer who visited

so many seniors' homes in her village, her old, worn-out shoes were due for replacement. The Christmas where she received a pair of shoes was especially memorable—it was her first-ever pair of new footwear. She wore them with pride everywhere for three years until they could no longer keep up.

Even after a decade, Jajja Florence's excitement for ROTOM's Christmas gifts remains undiminished. In her words, "I always look forward to these gifts even if I know there's a gift coming. I'm always wondering, guessing and very excited to know what our ROTOM people planned for us."

These seemingly small and insignificant gifts breathe new life into forgotten seniors, reminding them of their worth, love, and care. As we left Florence's house, she demonstrated the Christmas spirit of giving. Turning down money offered for a new mat she had weaved, she gifted it to her guest, radiating happiness from being able to share the joy she experiences.

In this season of giving, let us be reminded of the words from the Bible, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35). The true essence of Christmas lies not just in the gifts we receive but in the joy of giving,

n the heart of Kabulo village, where time seems to move slowly and stories are etched into the lines on weathered faces, a silent struggle against the biting cold persists. As Christmas approaches, the anticipation is not just for the festivities but for the warmth that comes in the form of thoughtful gifts from ROTOM.

In many villages with ROTOM supported older persons, there's a haunting nocturnal shiver—a chilling reality that transcends the mere drop in temperature. It's a struggle, a battle against the biting cold, where pulling up a tattered blanket offers little solace. In this cold harsh reality, seniors find themselves grappling with worn-out covers and battling the night as it seeps through the holes in their thin defenses.
